After recent news reports that highlighted concerns around lead in telecommunications the major employers have raised awareness about their voluntary blood lead testing programs. CWA has been following up with employers about their programs and initial reports from three of the major employers indicate that very few members have chosen to undergo blood lead level (BLL) testing.

We strongly encourage all members currently engaged in telecommunications work involving lead to participate in their employer's voluntary blood lead testing program. It is free. If members go for a blood lead test on their own through their healthcare providers, their insurance may not cover the cost of testing.
